



My focus areas in this collaborative* studio were the accessible suite and common corridor.

Three unique suites, including a family suite with an office, a vacation rental, and grandparent suite for the owner's retired parents, one of whom uses a wheelchair.

Precedent research of building typology and Art Deco and consideration of client needs suggested blending the luxury materials and dramatic forms of Art Deco with Industrial to create a relaxed yet elegant backdrop for an urbane modern family.





Creating a deep sill at bench level adds streamlined seating that does not interfere with wheelchair clearances, enabling the wheelchair user to join either the grouping anchored by the sofa or secondary perimeter seating near the window. Low windows offer views of the Manhattan sky from a seated position.



Turn a ceiling lift into an architectural feature by integrating it with a steel beam and offering a bespoke Deco-influenced headboard reminiscent of a Cedric Gibbons set.

Generous clearances around the bed and floating head-board-integrated nightstands make space for medical gear and nursing when necessary and clean-lined style when they are not.


The design solution creates spaces for group collaborative, focused group, and solo work modalities, socializing, and areas for respite and daydream.







My contributions in this collaborative* studio were visual concept/branding, including the interactive media park in the lobby, the 14,564 sq. ft. basement space plan, design and materials selection for the restaurant/cafe, and production of all 3D presentation renderings.

HOTEL GEN is an inn and spa.

Taking inspiration from nature and science, the place-based historic connection between the Falls and Nikola Tesla's electrical generating station, the concept for the project is Kinetic.

Visitors fuel up at the morning café—the Electric Bean—before zipping around the city on e-Bikes, recharging at our Float Spa before powering back up in the evening when the restaurant transforms into Alternating Current, a bistro/bar featuring regional cuisine, wine, and craft beer.




CONCEPT

KINETIC

KINETIC embodies a guest experience that offers a perceptible sense of motion.

Inspiration is drawn from nature, science, technology, and local history of the Falls and industrial power generation creating a dynamic setting that energizes guests and engages them in a unique journey at the intersection of nature and early 20th century technology.


Natural influences in the design include the fluid, dynamic forms of water in motion and elements of the earth that shift and grow, like tree roots and leaves, creating a constant cycle of generation and tranquility.




Concept line art inspired by the Falls L. Jeans, 2021






FLOOR PLAN BASEMENT : NTS




Curved forms set the stage: A central bar in the shape of a turbine that draws a flow of people, as a morning coffee bar that changes to a bistro and bar at night under an undulating ceiling.

Brick and concrete are left exposed in celebration of the building's industrial heritage and emphasized by other selectively added finishes that create contrast through texture and play of light upon them.


The climate crisis is the context for my research. Interior design in support of interdisciplinary research and innovation as a means of conjuring a collaborative parallel partnership between nature and humanity is the application.

I propose a site of interdisciplinary collisions in a former billiards table factory in a neighbourhood immersed in Toronto's industrial past to offer the community a research, event centre, and gallery to incite a different kind of industrial revolution and amplify the call to action.

My study is informed by the phenomenology and environmental ethics, biophilic design as a framework for a collaborative relationship with nature, and by Indigenous world views and local precedents. I use Deleuze and Guattari's *rhizome* to conjure a space that reflects and nourishes interdisciplinarity practice, space for generation of careful collaborative relationships with nature.






CONFLUENCE

A place where things flow together.

Ancient peoples held sacred gatherings and built communities at sites of confluence, finding abundant water and experiencing sublime views that connected them to nature and to each other.

Confluence is expressed through dynamic linear forms that undulate and merge together, offering a journey that runs into natural gathering spaces, energizing interdisciplinary collaboration and offering conference and gallery visitors a sense that they are participating in something sacred, important.

Materiality is aesthetically connected to river and glacier colour palettes, earth, water, rock, and stars in a dark night sky, drawing up on the sense of translucency shown by ice, and ethically committed to sustainable design informed by Living Building Challenge and LEED frameworks.





What does rhizomatic interior design look, feel, and sound like?

Connection / heterogeneity / multiplicity / asignifying rupture / cartography / decalcomania—rhizomatic concepts from Deleuze and Guattari—are assembled and mapped onto the plan.

I design this interior to deterritorialize disciplines and events, interlacing and overlapping spaces, infinitely fluidly transforming space, forming a collaboration between designer, inhabitants and nature: space and activities within as both research and performance.
